#### CREATING A NEW NORMAL


As we say farewell to March and all it brought — Women's History Month in which we paid homage to The Sisters of Charity of Our Lady of Mercy, and their vision to create a safe space for all who needed it in downtown Charleston and the Sea Islands, and Social Work Month where we acknowledged the hard work and dedication of our front line staff with social work backgrounds — we say hello to spring, a season of renewal and rebirth. One year ago, the first COVD19 case struck South Carolina. We did what we were built to do. We opened our doors even wider to assist neighbors in need. We focused on basic and emergency needs, providing an increased amount of food and financial help, unemployment and employment assistance at a time when our community needed it the most.

After adapting to meet emergency community needs, we have been slowly reopening our other core programs. We welcomed back our prenatal and GYN clients in July. We began our first virtual ESL class in September, and started the New Year with in-person classes again.

The Dental Clinic reopened in November for both emergency and regular procedures including root canals, fillings and cleanings. MUSC Residents returned for their rotation the first week of February. In February we also safely restarted our Yes, I Can! youth afterschool program in-person with a smaller group of children working hard to complete homework, Rocket Math activities, reading and a variety of other enrichment activities.

COVID19 has pushed us to find ways to innovate and rethink how we do our work to keep our doors open. Though we have had some setbacks of our own and sometimes struggle with functioning in crisis mode every day for over a year now, our staff's commitment in fulfilling our mission remains unwavering. It is the least we can do while many we serve face economic hardships made worse by the pandemic, thus making their road to self-sufficiency longer and even more difficult.

#### **GIVING A HELPING HAND**

Our second food and dental kit distribution held on March 6, was a great success. We served 219 households, and gave out over 500 dental kits. The Saturday distribution is a contact-less, drive-thru model designed to keep staff and patrons safe. We chose to incorporate a Saturday distribution to fill the gap of those community members who need help, but do not have the availability to come during our regular assistance hours throughout the week. When we held our first distribution in October, more families and individuals came to get necessary staples than we had initially plan for, so we know that this is something that is needed.
